The Salvation Army was able to trace Kylie and she came from interstate to spend time with Hal for his birthday. Kylie was also able to bring a message from her brother in Canada for their father. Hal was thrilled to see his daughter after many years and to also have contact again with his son. Sometimes opportunities like this give people renewed hope and confidence for a better future.
