Rewarding partnership receives award

Farewell Richard Humble (1954-2012)

A little over two weeks' ago, Hutt St Centre lost one of our long-term clients who passed away on a friend's couch.

What makes this story even sadder is that Richard had been house-sitting for his friend (another HSC client) while she had a short stay in hospital. Our staff members had arranged to pick her up when she was discharged from hospital, but when they arrived back at her unit they found that Richard had sadly passed away there a few days earlier.

The difficult part for our staff to come to terms with, is that if Richard had not stayed at his friend's home...where would he have passed away? And how long would it have been before someone found him, had it not been for our staff?

We decided that we needed to celebrate Richard's life in a way that reflected his lovely character.

So, after his sister was contacted, we organised a Memorial Service at Adelaide Oval which was attended by approximately 40 people, including Hutt St Centre staff, Richard's sister who had travelled up to Adelaide, a small contingent of our client group and representatives from Richard's beloved Northern Districts Cricket Club (NDCC).

A number of years ago, Richard started volunteering for the NDCC and became their 'A Grade' Team Manager – a position he cherished.

We were all thrilled to see so many people from the cricket club turn out to honour and respect Richard's achievements and volunteer work he did for them.

Richard loved his sport (cricket and football) and would talk about this incessantly, while accessing our services.

At times he wouldn't leave us alone, as he talked about all the Footy Clubs that he supported, in particular Norwood and Richmond.

Richard was a terrific fellow, much loved by our staff members and fiercely independent. We will miss him dearly. Monday mornings will never be the same at Hutt St Centre again: without Richard's football banter; tips; and 'excuses' as to why his teams either won or lost.

RIP Richard. We will miss you.

Stepping off the streets and into a new home.

Our Boarding House Outreach Support Program supports clients who are living in tertiary homelessness, which means that they live in a boarding house: one step up from couch-surfing; or living on the streets. Four of our clients have recently made a successful transition into long-term accommodation thanks to housing applications made to both *Housing SA* and community housing offered by *Frederic Ozanam Housing Association*. One client in particular has had a challenging life but since connecting with Hutt St Centre, he has been able to manage his health thanks to the Royal Adelaide Hospital and the wonderful RDNS based at HSC, the Primary Homelessness Team and BHOSP. Until recently, this client had lived an itinerant lifestyle in both Darwin and Queensland, before relocating to Adelaide in 2010.

Together, we have worked on a Housing application and a Needs assessment, which clearly demonstrated his need for independent housing and he was placed on Category I, with no specific date until a property was found.

After waiting four months, a one bedroom unit was offered close to the city and this was just what he wanted. In addition, HSC assisted with finding him a single bed, a bookcase, a television and other household items so he could enhance his new abode — a terrific result.
