a simple thank you

For the past 10 years, a local resident and friend of HSC had been offering a sandwich or a couple of dollars to one of our most vulnerable clients early each morning as he wandered slowly past his house on his way to breakfast at Hutt Street.

There had never been a word spoken between Jack and 'L', who had always taken the offering and gone quietly on his way.

Recently, Jack and his wife returned from a few months away on holiday. On his first day back, Jack noticed the time and raced downstairs—only to see 'L' wandering away in the distance, head down, tucked into his jacket collar as usual.

When he called out his name, 'L' turned around and wandered back to meet Jack. Handing him a few dollars as usual, 'L' turned to Jack and for the first time in 10 years said, 'thank you', before heading off down the road again.

Inspiring stories at launch

Those who attended The Bia Picnic @ Touch Wine launch were privileged to hear from Fionn and Stanley who have both had periods of homelessness and been supported into housing through HSC. After working in the building industry, Fionn suffered a breakdown, leading to drug and alcohol misuse, and time spent on the streets.
